- (e) Discuss briefly the theme of alienation and loneliness in the poem, *Tonight I Can Write*.
- (f) "There were two kinds of men in the world." Discuss Bessie Head's views on men with reference to *The Collector of Treasures*.

- (b) Analyze the character of Nyagar in *The Green Leaves*.
- (c) Discuss the social and historical context of the novel, *Chronicle of a Death Foretold*.
- (d) "Derek Walcott's poetry address the post-colonial issues of identity and history." Discuss with reference to the poems prescribed in the course.
- (e) Discuss how in *Funny Boy*, Selvadurai explores the theme of homosexuality in a homophobic world.
- (f) "Women writers in Africa write with the intention of giving voice and agency to the women across the continent." Discuss with reference to the two short stories from your course.
